



LLOYD HERMAN (1937-2023)

We are saddened by Lloyd Herman's passing this January during surgery for injuries incurred from a fall. Lloyd was preceded in death by his life partner Dick Wilson who passed away in 2021.



Lloyd was a true friend of NWDC as an Honorary Member. He was a force for good, a national champion of fine craft, and a friend to so many. He was a humble man who significantly influenced careers, achieved great success as founding Director of the Renwick Gallery at the Smithsonian American Art Museum, and greatness in fine craft around the world mingling with presidents, kings, and queens. - Nancy Loorem Adams

Everyone knows that the opening of the Renwick Gallery in Washington DC – almost 5 decades ago – came from Lloyd's idea, imagination, curiosity, and guts. As the first director, he asked everyone to take a fresh look at the handmade through the lens of craftsmanship and design, to see craft as art. As a fine craft organization, we owe him a lot. - Lynn Di Nino

Naoko Morisawa invites viewers to experience *Happy Room — Mosaic Collage*, a collection of over 50 small, mid, and large-scale works that evoke a sense of joy and draw from the Hygge lifestyle. The installation is divided into four rooms, Shoes/Closet, Kitchen/Living Room, Theater Japonism/Living Room, and Heart Room.

Each piece and room transforms everyday objects like a dependable pair of shoes or a pastry from a café into ornate, dynamic mosaics that invite viewers to find beauty in the details. *Happy Room — Mosaic Collage* features pieces from various bodies of work from the past 15 years including pieces from *My Collection Shoes*, *Mosaic Café*, *Japanese Opera - Noh Mask*, and

Katazome Today presents contemporary visions of a unique and historically significant Japanese textile-dyeing process. Traditionally used for kimono dyeing, katazome involves the application of a rice-paste resist using special stencil papers with complex designs. Both the techniques of katazome, and those of the intricately hand carved stencil papers (katagami), have been passed down through generations of artisans over several centuries.


