NWDC's first in person exhibition since *Currents 2020* will be at Honorary members Ginny and Jim Clarke's *Clarke and Clarke Art + Artifact Gallery* on Mercer Island running August through September 2022. Rif on the ubiquitous shoe in your favored media within either 10" X 10" 2D or 10" X 10" X 10" 3D dimensions. No creation timeframe requirement, earlier works permitted. In addition to the gallery exhibition, the show will also be displayed on the NWDC website in the same format as recent virtual NWCraft shows linked to the gallery for sales.

Each member who enters will have a piece in the show. All pieces for sale.

An opening reception will be held at the gallery on Saturday, August 6th. The neighborhood boasts six restaurants, Barrels Wine Bar next door, and Island Treats sweets shop across the street. The Saturday, August 6th opening will allow for outdoor socializing--finally!

Clarke and Clarke Art and Artifact Gallery has an extensive network, drawing attention from interior designers and art aficionados. They maintain online sales with national connections in addition to deep roots in Scottsdale and Santa Fe arts communities, both locations of the gallery in earlier times.

More information and a prospectus will be available soon. The deadline to enter will likely be the end of June.

NWDC is proud and lucky to have been working with FIDGET FILMS, the video team who have now created videos on Ron Ho, Tip Toland and Lloyd Herman. *They are a Seattle based film production company. For the past 30 years John and Gayle have produced a*

variety of media content, including award-winning documentaries, feature films, and television shows. Their approach is first, and foremost, to be storytellers. We've been impressed with their ability to strike a balance, melding images and sound to inform, engage, and excite the viewer, while always keeping sight of the heart of the story. Fidget films has produced and directed over 26 art profile films, 14 documentaries all airing on National and local PBS stations, and The Seattle Channel. Whereas they have focused on films about artists and their work, music, historical documentaries and wildlife, their experience ranges from feature films, music videos, corporate branding to non-profit work. Fidget Films has garnered 16 Emmy Awards, 12 Gold NY Film Festival Awards, 1 Cannes Gold Lion Award, and many 'Best of Fest' awards. Their most recent Emmy Award winning documentary, Pilchuck; A Dance with Fire, is currently being screened at several Museums and film festivals. In addition, Public Television will provide national distribution of the documentary for the next three years.

The Gallery at the Park was proud to present the fine craft of NWDC art. They were especially pleased that the exhibition produced \$3,600 in sales, which represented 25% of their sales for the period. The Gallery's portion was \$1,260. The entire process we have used successfully for two years from jurying to web display proved easy for them. Over 800 views of the NWDC web site occurred over the period of the show and thousands of people saw the 50 or so Facebook/Instagram posts by our Social Media master, Barbara DePirro. Special thanks go to Danielle Bodine and Claire Jones of the Exhibitions Committee for their efforts in making sure this show was a success.

The Virtual Shows present the craftsmanship you produce to wider audiences, plus provides a benefit to our partner art organizations. We, as an organization, benefit from continually showing the amazing talent of our artists.



When Cappy Thompson designs a glass commission she considers the location and use and themes she can develop. In the past two years, Cappy has lived through inside an art episode and become Chair of the Board at Pottery Northwest during a time of multiple changes in staffing, programs, covid issues, and an occasional respite dinner with old friends Dick Weiss and Lynn DiNino, joined by Phen Huang, owner and director of Foster White Gallery. As it turns out, the gallery and the pottery are about the same age and after continuing conversation, Cappy and Phen made it possible to move the pottery from an ancient garage in Seattle Center to the completely redesigned lower level of the gallery in Pioneer Square.

Just like her figures in her glass grisaille paintings, Cappy was steady and moved ahead thoughtfully and with a delightful smile...when multiple terrors of continual change did not go smoothly. Phen did as much as possible to accommodate the remodel of the space, with her usual ease and grace. Staff and volunteers are clay gods and goddesses.

Last weekend the first part of the move was completed and we are excited for Cappy to lead the Board and community of staff and makers in reopening PNW-V2 sometime this spring.
